

N1 PROJECT NAME: Alesinloye Market Water Wells Project:

LOCATION: Lagos

Rotary Club of: Ibadan West

Summary: The proposed project is to provide deep bore hole wells to provide the only clean, fresh potable water to one of the largest Markets in Ibadan. The market, commonly called the

Iloro Market, was established in 1990, has more than 10,000 lock up shops, and serves a daily average of 40,000 people. There are an estimated 80,000 residents in the surrounding settlements who would



have access to these sustainable water sources. The current sources of water available in the market place are not fit for drinking because they are contaminated in one way or other. The children are most affected because of their poor immunity to diseases and infections,

which result is most of the children being malnourished. Recently, because of the lack of a substantial water supply, a fire destroyed a portion of the market which caused the loss of many of the traders' valuables and assets. The economic impact is still being measured. The surrounding settlements affected are



populated by low income, low socio-economic peasant farmers semi- skilled tradesmen, students, and others. The oversight of the utilization of funding will be provided by members of the RC of Ibadan - West who have vocations related water project/drilling.

The operation/maintenance of the wells will be carried out by select tradesmen.
