

N2 PROJECT NAME: Aba-Igbira Market/community Water Well:

LOCATION: Lagos area

Rotary Club of: Iyaganku-Ibadan

Summary: The proposed project is to provide deep bore hole well(s) with manual hand pump, to provide the only clean, fresh potable water to the Aba-Igbira Community which consists of 80,000 residents and the



four lesser settlements of Aba-Idigba, Aba-Opo, Aba-Oba, and Aba-Panu. This area surrounds a state run hospital. The community and settlements' residents are mainly peasant farmers, artisans,



mechanics, barbers, painters, self employed, students, and others. They are low income earners and low socio-economic position. The areas described above face perennial water shortages. Recent efforts to make water available through digging of deep wells have

not met their regular needs and requirements. During the dry season, about six months, villagers must travel many kilometers in search of potable water. Often they are forced to obtain water from the available streams, ponds, or brooks, this water is used for cooking, bathing, and sometimes drinking. Local residents are not allowed to obtain water at the health care facility.

The oversight of the expenditure of funds will be provided by members of the RC of Iyaganku-Ibadan whose vocations are related to water projects and drilling. The commitment to sustain and maintain the project has been made by the residents and landlords.
